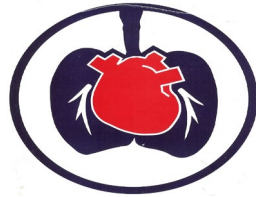




ADULT CARDIOVASCULAR PATHOLOGY
